Greetings :

Thank you for your interest in joining the Sacramento Amateur Radio Communications Reserves. There are three nationally recognized Amateur Radio emergency organizations: RACES (Radio Amateur Civil Emergency Services), which is authorized by the Federal Government to support local disaster communications; ARES (Amateur Radio Emergency Services), which was developed by the national Amateur Radio organization, ARRL; and ACS (Auxiliary Communications Service) locally, officially sponsored volunteers. Basically, the three organizations support disaster response programs in different ways. Currently, the SARCR is a combined RACES-ARES-ACS program.

In addition, membership in the SARCR and City RACES, automatically registers you as a "Disaster Service Worker (communications)" under the California Emergency Services Act. You need not re-register with another government agency to provide mutual aid communication services if you are available. In fact, many government agencies will only accept properly registered RACES Amateur Radio Operators in a disaster situation.

As a member of the SARCR you will be eligible to receive the training necessary to allow you to become an important part of Auxiliary Emergency Communications in the Sacramento Area. This training may consist of on the air instruction and drills, deployment drills, and participation in communications for special events like marathons. We are sponsored by a government agency and have access to resources for training that are not normally available to amateur radio operators.

Once your application is received and approved you must participate in order to maintain an active status in the SARCR. Participation includes, but is not limited to: on the air check-ins, emergency activations (if you are available), and other special event communications.

SARCR members receive a Sacramento City Auxiliary Communications ID card. This ID card is issued by and remains the property of the City of Sacramento. It identifies you as an Auxiliary Communications Volunteer. When the SARCR is activated, and the members are deployed, the ID card may allow you access to areas you would not normally be able to enter.
